Equipment

All campers must have the following items:

 - Water bottle
- Bag for personal belongings

When you come to the fork in the driveway, turn left to the gate entrance of MacNair's Country Acres. The office is in the front of the barn. **From the east:** Take I 40 West to exit 295 (Gorman St.) Turn left. See above.
